With international bases in Norway, Egypt and Nigeria, TWMA is a world leader in the handling and treatment of hydrocarbon contaminated drill cuttings and other drilling waste materials. It is the only SME in the world to process these cuttings offshore using thermal technology, separating them into their constituent parts of water, oil and solids, all of which can then be recycled.

Earlier this year TWMA was awarded the Sir Ian Wood award for Innovation at the Grampian Awards for Business Enterprise as well as a prestigious financial award for its management buy out at the Deal and Dealmakers Awards.
